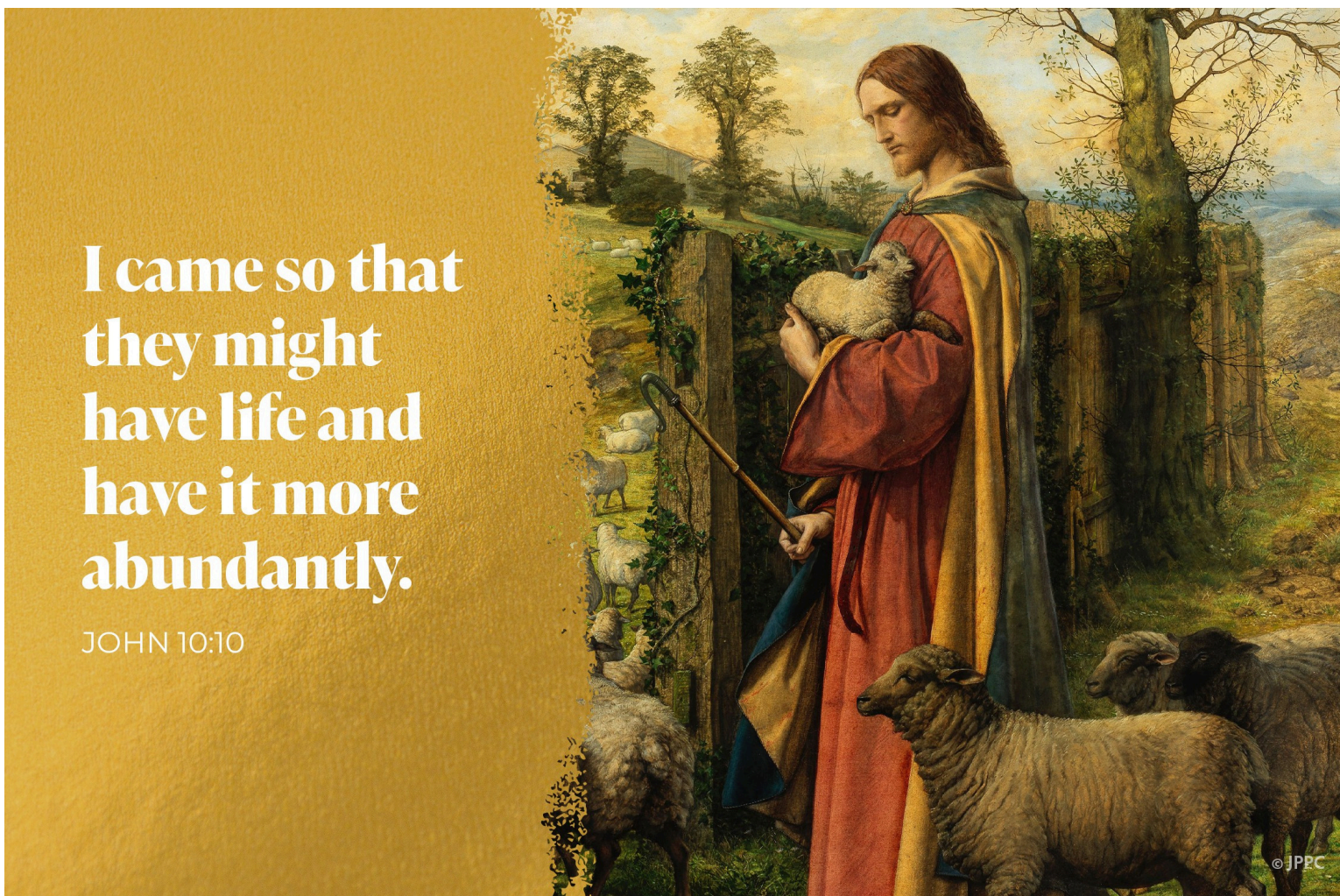

First Communion

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday. Our second graders will receive First Holy Communion at the 10:00 AM Mass and crown Mary – Queen of the May – with flowers. First Communion for our Hispanic children will be next Sunday at the Spanish Mass. These children are God’s garden. They are like a cantaloupe patch with eyes. Isaiah calls them God’s vineyard.

“Let me sing now for my Beloved

A song of my Beloved concerning his vineyard.

My Beloved had a vineyard on a fertile hill” (Isaiah 5:1).

We must tend this vineyard. We must also receive every Communion like it’s our first and last Communion. Earth and heaven come together in this happy encounter at every Mass.

Second grade is a good time for First Communion. Kids are entering the “Age of Reason,” beginning to grasp right and wrong. It’s an age of discovery but without the seriousness. In my opinion, they are entering the “golden years” of ages eight and nine. Play is learning.

Learning is play. It’s an age of primeval rationality, curiosity, imagination – an innocent romance with adventure and discovery.

Carl Schmitt, an American artist, said childhood is not just a preparation for adult life but “a thing unique and complete in itself – a masterpiece of God.”

“Nascantur in admiratione.” “Let them be born in wonder,” goes the old saying. Learning begins with delight. Delight leads to wonder.

Wonder is God’s invitation to a love which leads to wisdom. Golden-age kids are becoming capable of loyal friendship, including with Jesus.

Jesus stories provoke imaginations to learn about God and Creation. Miracles, angels, saints, Bible stories, art, music, poems, and prayers feed children’s maturing souls and imaginations. We humans must know the rhymes before the reasons.

Our children have received Christ’s Body and Blood. Teach them to live and love in the grace they receive. Form their hearts in the beauty of Catholic faith and morals. “Be shepherds of God’s flock that is under your care, watching over them...” (1 Peter 5:2).

“The only cure for sagging or fainting faith is Communion. Though always Itself, perfect and complete and inviolate, the Blessed Sacrament does not operate completely and once for all in any of us. Like the act of Faith it must be continuous and grow by exercise” (J.R.R. Tolkien).

Volunteer Opportunities at OLOL:

- **ALTER GUILDE/ALTAR FLOWERS** keep the church beautiful by caring for the sacred vessels, linens, candles, liturgical dressings, tabernacle, and arrange flowers for the church.
- **ALTER SERVERS** are youths who ensure the liturgy flows smoothly during Masses.
- **CCD TEACHERS** explain and share the basic fundamentals of the faith with the young people of the parish and prepare them to receive Sacraments.
- **CCD HALL MONITOR/ASSISTANT TEACHER** ensure the safety of children attending CCD.
- **CHOR** participants bring joy and the magic of music to the Masses.
- **CHURCH DECORATING:** Decorate the Church for Christmas and Easter.
- **EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION:** distribute Holy Communion at Mass or bring Holy Communion to those who are unable to attend Mass in their homes.
- **GARDENING COMMUNITY** works on small garden projects on the church lawn and flower beds.
- **HELPING HANDS** collects and delivers nonperishable food to Christ House every other month. They also organize biannual drives to support Migration & Refugee Services.
- **HOSPITALITY** helps organize and plan events, dinners, and socials to bring the parish together.
- **KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS**, a Catholic men's fraternal organization, supports and serves the parish community.
- **LECTORS** read from the Sanctuary during weekend and week day Masses.
- **LEGION OF MARY** members meet, pray, work in pairs to reach out to those interested in the Catholic faith, and visit homebound individuals or those in need.
- **MONEY COUNTERS** steward the offertory collections by working in teams of three or more.
- **PRO LIFE VOLUNTEERING** supports pro-life activities and provide assistance to pregnancy resource centers.
- **SACRISTANS** assist before Mass to prepare the sanctuary for worship.
- **ST. VINCENT DE PAUL** members help neighbors in emergency situations with financial support and friendship.
- **USHER** greet parishioners, pass out bulletins, and take up collection during Mass.

Primera Comunión

Hoy es el Domingo del Buen Pastor. Nuestros alumnos de segundo grado recibirán la Primera Comunión durante la misa de las 10:00 AM y coronarán a María – Reina de Mayo – con flores. La Primera Comunión de nuestros niños y niñas de la comunidad hispana será el próximo domingo en la Misa en español. Todos estos niños son el jardín de Dios. Ellos son como un huerto de frutas con caras infantiles. Isaías los llama el viñedo de Dios.

"Déjame cantar ahora en nombre de mi Amado
Una canción sobre su viñedo.

Mi Amado tenía un viñedo en una loma fértil." (Isaías 5:1)

Debemos cuidar este viñedo. También debemos recibir cada Comunión como si fuera nuestra primera y última Comunión. La tierra y el cielo se encuentran en esta feliz reunión en cada misa.

El Segundo grado es un buen momento para la Primera Comunión. Los niños están entrando en la "Era de la Razón", empezando a comprender lo que está bien y lo que está mal. Es una época de descubrimientos, pero sin seriedad. En mi opinión, están entrando a los "años dorados" de los ocho y nueve años. Jugar es aprender.

Aprender es jugar. Es una época de racionalidad, curiosidad e imaginación primeriza: un romance inocente con aventura y descubrimiento. Carl Schmitt, un artista estadounidense, dijo que la infancia no es sólo una preparación para la vida adulta, sino "algo único y completo en sí mismo: una obra maestra de Dios."

"Nascantur en admiración." "Que nazcan en admiración", dice el viejo dicho. El aprendizaje comienza con el gozo. El gozo lleva a la admiración. La admiración es la invitación de Dios a un amor que conduce a la sabiduría. Los niños de la edad dorada están volviéndose capaces de una amistad leal, incluso con Jesús. Las historias de Jesús estimulan la imaginación para aprender sobre Dios y la Creación. Los milagros, los ángeles, los santos, las historias bíblicas, el arte, la música, los poemas y las oraciones alimentan las almas y la imaginación crecientes de los niños. Los humanos debemos conocer los sentimientos antes que las razones.

Nuestros hijos han recibido el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Enséñales a vivir y amar en la gracia que han recibido. Formen su corazón en la belleza de la fe católica y la moralidad. "Apacienten el Rebaño de Dios, que les ha sido confiado; velen por él..." (1 Pedro 5:2).

"La única cura para la fe que se decae o se languidece es la Comunión. Aunque siempre Él mismo, perfecto, completo e inviolable, el Santísimo Sacramento no opera de forma completa y definitiva en ninguno de nosotros. Como el acto de la fe, debe ser continua y crecer mediante el ejercicio." (J.R.R. Tolkien)

- **Ministros Extraordinarios de la Sagrada Comunión:** Distribuyen la Sagrada Comunión durante la Misa o la llevan a los hogares de aquellos que no pueden asistir a la iglesia.
- **Monitores / Asistentes de Catequesis (CCD):** Velan por la seguridad de los niños que asisten a las clases de catecismo.
- **Sacristanes:** Asisten antes de la Misa para preparar el santuario para la celebración de la liturgia
- **Ujieres:** Reciben a los feligreses, distribuyen los boletines y realizan la colecta durante la Misa.
- **Voluntariado Pro-vida:** Apoyan actividades en defensa de la vida y brindan asistencia a centros de recursos para embarazadas.
